## POLICE IN FIERCE ANARCHIST FIGHT

House In Which Meeting Was Held In Odessa Was Surrounded—Several Killed and Many Taken Prisoners.

Odessa, Oct. 4.—A strong detachment of police, mostly in plain clothes, had a desperate fight with a band of anarchists last night, resulting in the capture of fifty-three of them. The police, hearing that the anarchists were meeting in a certain house, prepared to surround it and were about to break into the building when the anarchists discovered their presence, fired on them, and killed Assistant Chief of Police Delfinsky and wounded several plain-clothes men. The police then made a rush for the building, and a fierce hand-to-hand fight followed, during which a woman was killed and two men were mortally wounded and nearly all the anarchists captured.

## GRAND JURY AFTER LUMBER TRUST

Federal Body at Minneapolis Resumes Investigation of the "Little Black Book" Used in Ruining Small Dealers.

Minneapolis, Oct. 4.—The federal Grand Jury to-day resumed the investigation of the Little Black Book, which catalogue houses dealing in lumber and manufactured articles, alleged has been used by the lumber trust in an effort to ruin the mail order offices. It is now known that there was a secret meeting of lumber dealers in Minneapolis last winter and later a similar meeting of about sixty lumbermen in Chicago. The book was published here after the Chicago meeting.

## HINDUS DRIVEN OUT OF WASHINGTON

Several Revolver Shots Were Fired by People of Danville to Send Men Back to British Columbia.

Spokane, Oct. 4.—A race riot occurred at Danville, Wash., last night, in which ten Hindus, who had come across the Canadian line, were mobbed and driven back into Canada. The Hindus had secured a cabin and retired early in the evening. A crowd of men and boys surrounded the cabin in the darkness and began to throw stones. Three of the Hindus were struck by stones, but not seriously injured. This morning the Hindus went back into British Columbia. Several revolver shots were fired, but only to frighten them.

## CLERGYMAN IS UNDER ARREST

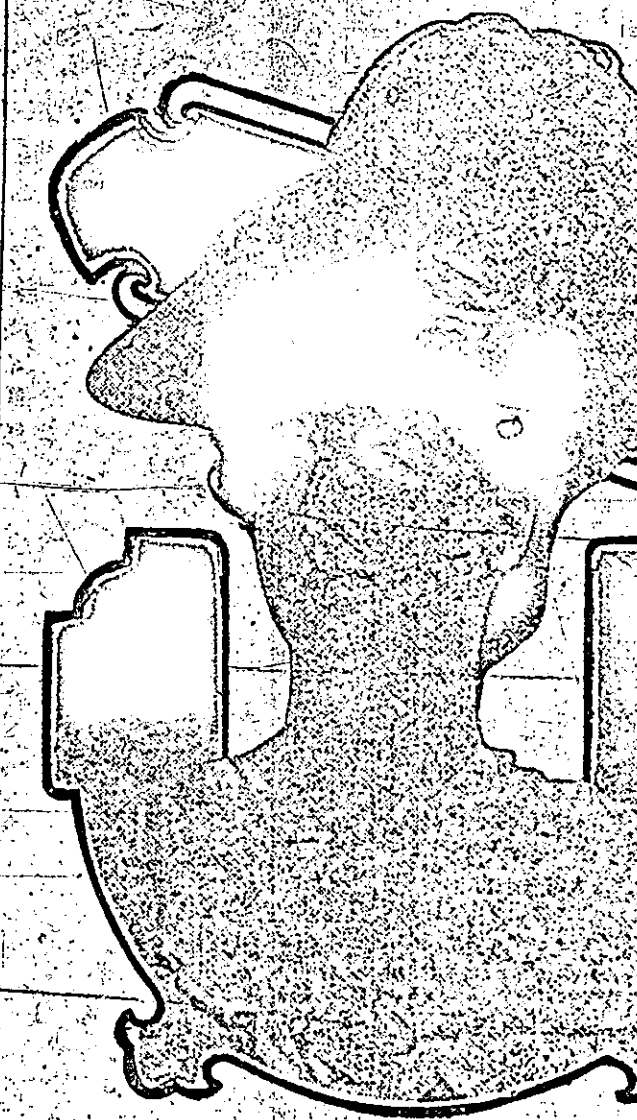
Rev. W. P. Ferguson Appears in Limelight Again on Charge of Having Criminal Relations with Wife of Complainant.
