

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

Most UFV programs require BC high school graduation or equivalent.
Equivalencies include the BC Adult Graduation (Adult Dogwood) diploma and the General Education diploma (GED). Learn more: ufv.ca/calendar

ENGLISH REQUIREMENTS

English is the language of instruction at UFV. To be successful, applicants must demonstrate English language proficiency for their level of study. International students should review acceptable English test scores.



Every year, millions of dollars in federal and provincial loans, grants, bursaries, scholarships, and awards are processed and disbursed to UFV students through UFV's Financial Aid and Awards office.

If you're enrolling at UFV in the academic year immediately following your high school graduation, you may qualify for a UFV entrance scholarship. Recipients are selected based on academic excellence, community and school involvement, volunteer experience, and leadership activities. The application deadline is March 1 (September 1 for Trades programs).
